Tallest living species on earth (sequoia sempervirens); some exceed 360 feet in height.	How tall are you standing spiritually?	
Always green; creates lush groves.	 Do others look to you for counsel during a crisis? 	
Inhabits sheltered, well-watered places of rich soil.	 Where do you find your nourishment; what values are you cultivating? 	
 Long-lasting; oldest tree is at least 2,200 years of age. 	 Is your life marked by perseverance and endurance?

GOOD ROOTS Lesson 1

1. How to plant them and bring about growth:

Colossians 2 (NASB)

- 6 As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him,
- having been **firmly rooted** and now **being built up in Him** and **established in your faith**, just as you were instructed, and **overflowing with gratitude**.
- 8 See to it that no one takes you captive through philosophy and empty deception, according to the tradition of men, according to the elementary principles of the world, rather than according to Christ.
- 9 For in Him all the fulness of Deity dwells in bodily form,
- 10 and in Him you have been made complete, and He is the head over all rule and authority;

Matthew 13 (NASB)

- 19 "When anyone **hears the word** of the kingdom, and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what has been sown in his heart. This is the one on whom seed was sown beside the road.
- 20 And the one on whom seed was sown on the rocky places, this is the man who hears the word, and immediately **receives it with joy**;
- 21 yet he has no firm root in himself, but is only temporary, and when affliction or persecution arises because of the word, immediately he falls away.
- And the one on whom seed was sown among the thorns, this is the man who hears the word, and the worry of the world, and the deceitfulness of riches choke the word, and it becomes unfruitful.
- 23 And the one on whom seed was sown on the good soil, this is the man who hears the word and **understands it**; who indeed **bears fruit**, and brings forth, some a hundredfold, some sixty, and some thirty."

2. What they will enable you to do:
